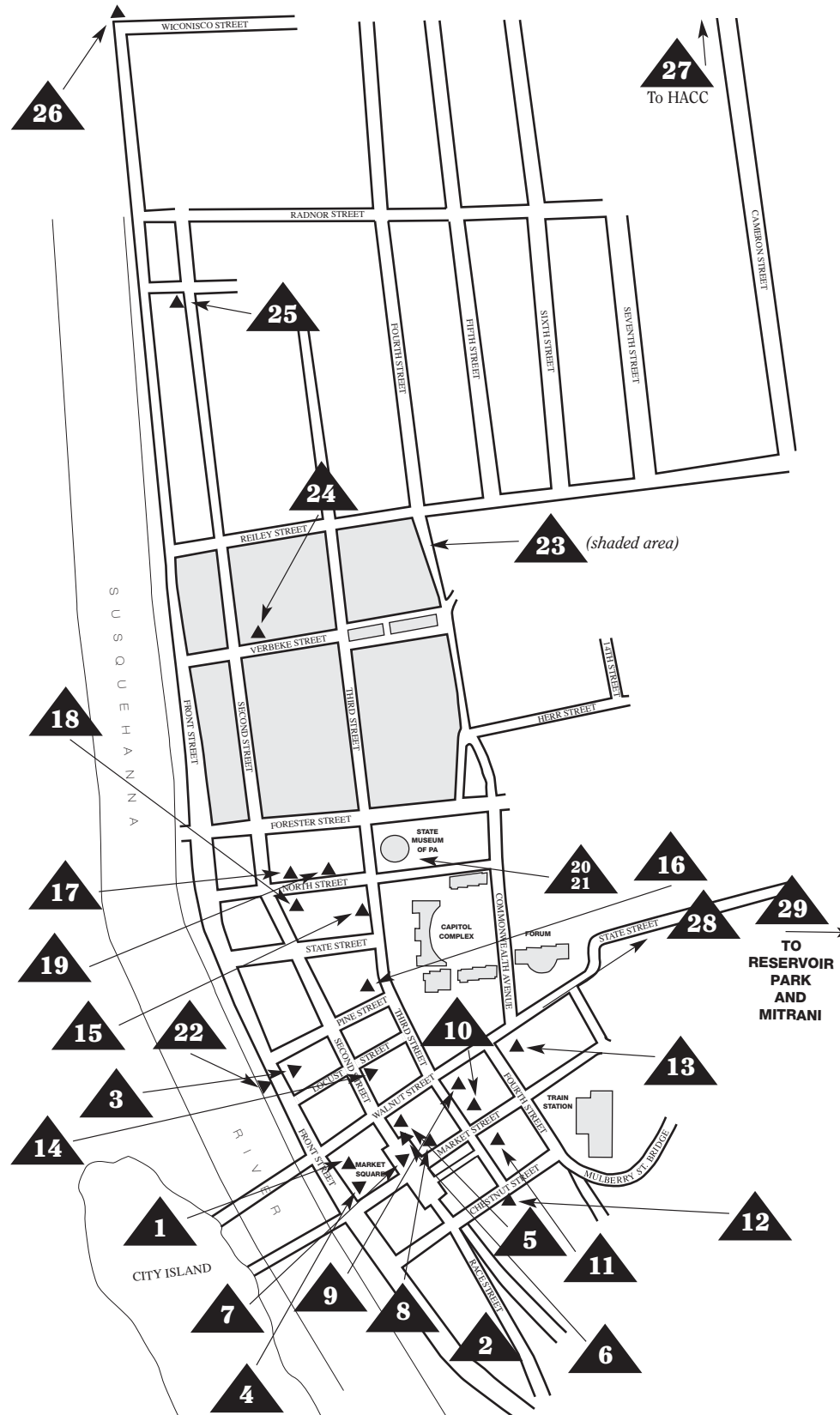

Exhibition Space:The Milestone Inn is an early 20th-century Tudor Revival mansion which shares its design of Medieval English tradition with French Eclecticism. The L-shaped property is constructed of stone with towering, steeply-pitched slate roofs; half-timbering and stucco in the projecting gabled entrance; irregularly-placed ribbons of metal casement windows; and elegant groupings of decorative double-brick chimneys. The beautiful and rare mansion is a newly-opened B&B, deftly integrating into the urban setting. On the lawn expanse inside the wrought-iron fence, an open-air tented exhibit space will host the Route 15 Byway of the Arts partner artists.
