The Art Association of Harrisburg is pleased to present *Relational Structures/On Site*, two separate sculptural exhibitions under one roof. The first floor galleries will feature *Relational Structures* a collection of work by Kathryn Yoder. *On Site* featuring the work of Nicole Herbert will be installed in the second floor galleries. These two exhibitions, both hosted by David Volkman, will run from April 8-May 12 with a reception, hosted by Dr. Mary Simmonda, on Friday, April 15 from 5-8pm.

Relational Structures: Kathryn Yoder

Yoder addresses statements of bodily and physical nature as well as relational interactions in her work. She finds significance in highly responsive ways of making, a process accommodating physical play, as well as a search for interrelationship and harmony of conversation between material and form. The physical act of mark-making serves as the materialization of traces of human presence. Yoder imposes relational history between one medium and another, while seeking to allow each material to remain its own entity. Yoder's work is comprised of reactionary responses to possibility and opportunity in space and surface. These works investigate a heightened consciousness around space and environment. They are the result of a striving toward order through synthesizing intuitive materiality and surfaces that speak to organic breakdown within structures that manifest a reimagining of architecture and proverbial structures.

On Site: Nicole Herbert

Herbert's artistic practice is guided by the question, "How can art be used to call attention to things that we take for granted?" This question is inspired by her anthropology studies as an undergraduate and her time living abroad in Niger, West Africa as a Peace Corps volunteer. Studying other cultures helped cultivate a respect for different perspectives. Living in a foreign country for an extended period of time challenged what Herbert took for granted and provided a new perception of her home when she returned. In keeping with Victor Skhlovsky's idea of *ostranenie*, or having the familiar or commonplace made strange, Herbert seeks to highlight overlooked aspects of the everyday in her work. Herbert uses sculpture, drawing, and photography to punctuate the physical and conceptual constructs of everyday environments. She translates elements of our everyday environments into different materials and juxtaposes these variations with the existing elements. Herbert uses materials so that viewers can tell what the objects are made out of. She is curious about the construction of meaning and thinks about how this construction can be a more dynamic process. Herbert is attempting to encourage more active perceptions of our physical environment by challenging conventional ways of looking. This perceptual shift opens up the possibility for experiencing the world less reflexively and by implication questions the mechanisms that filter and mediate our experience.

94th Annual Juried Exhibition Prize Juror Announced



AAH curator Rachel O'Connor has identified a very prestigious juror for the 2022 international exhibition – Nadiah Rivera Fellah, a Curator at the Cleveland Museum of Art.

The timeline, entry, submission, and payment information for the 94th Annual Juried Exhibition is posted on the AAH website –www.artassocofhbg.com. The submission deadline will be Wednesday, April 20. Artists will be notified of the juror's decision on Wednesday, May 4. The Juried Exhibition will open with a reception on Friday evening, May 20, and will remain on view in the AAH galleries through July 7.

Nadiah Rivera Fellah joined the Cleveland Museum of Art in 2019. Prior to that, Ms. Fellah served in various capacities at the Newark Museum, New Jersey. Most recently at Newark, she curated the celebrated exhibition “Wendy Red Star: A Scratch on the Earth,” and served as the primary author and editor for the accompanying catalogue. She has held curatorial positions at the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, and the Allen Memorial Art Museum at Oberlin College.

Ms. Fellah specializes in Latin American and global contemporary art. Her publications include “Picturing Motherhood Now” (New Haven, CT: Yale University Press, 2021); “Graciela Iturbide’s “Cholo/a Series: Images of Cross-Border Identities,” in the journal “History of Photography (2019), among others.

3rd Annual “Free For All” Student-Member Exhibition is back!

Back by popular demand, the third Annual “Free for All,” our student and member exhibition, will be held at AAH from July 15 through August 18, sponsored by Seward & Debra Ryan. All AAH Members and past year's AAH students are eligible to enter one work in any style or media in this open show.

Eligibility: The show is open to all AAH students from the past year's classes and all current members.

Intake Dates: Members, students, or students' parents should deliver the artwork to the Art Association between June 20 and July 10, during regular gallery hours, Monday through Thursday 9:30am-9pm, Friday 9:30am-4pm, Saturday 10am-4pm, and Sunday 2-5pm.

Requirements: Each AAH member or student may enter ONE work of art with any subject matter and in any media. All two-dimensional adult works MUST have screw-eyes and wires on the back for hanging. Works on paper MUST be frames under glass or plexiglass, with NO exposed glass edges. Works on canvas may either be framed OR have the edges painted. Children's works may either be framed or mounted on foam core and shrinkwrapped. Three-dimensional works will be displayed on AAH sculpture bases.

Entry Fees: The fee is \$10 per entry for works smaller than 48” in any direction, and \$15 per entry for works 49” to 72” in any direction.

CERAMICS & SCULPTURE

Hand-Built Pottery

(Ages 15 through Adult, Reservoir Park Pottery Studio, 6 weeks)

PAINTING & MIXED MEDIA

Acrylic Painting

(Ages 15 through Adult, AAH Third Floor, 6 weeks)

This class is for new, intermediate, and seasoned artists who want to learn the basics of acrylic painting, including color theory, color mixing, and painting techniques. We will learn about acrylic paint by working on primed and unprimed canvases of different sizes. Using photos, still-life objects, and imagination, students will become familiar with this medium, learn methods of composition, and paint application; creating works of art that are worthy of display.

The instructor will work with individual students to develop their own personal style and technique, assisting them in choice of subject matter. Composition, color mixing, and handling the medium of choice in a variety of ways will be covered. Possible media may include: watercolor, acrylics, ink, markers, and collage on board or paper. Demonstrations and personalized instruction will be included. The instructor will discuss supplies at the first session.

The first class will be conducted at an outdoor location so it is essential for students to register **IN ADVANCE** so that the instructor is able to contact everyone with the place to meet! Students must bring their supplies and easels to the first class. Some travel is involved so it is necessary for participants to have transportation. **PLEASE NOTE THAT THIS IS NOT A BEGINNING-LEVEL PAINTING CLASS.** Students with limited painting experience should consider taking our Basic Oil or Acrylic courses.
