Before I go into that though, there is something I said at our recent Blue-Green Gala that I think is worth repeating: The past two years have been incredibly difficult for all of us - a global pandemic that has claimed more than a million American lives, a racial injustice reckoning, and an unprecedented attack on American democracy. Art is a powerful tool that can help us all explore, share, and better understand these issues.

Art can also heal, bring joy, and entertain. It is the power of art, and the artists in our local community, that we come together to celebrate.

This is what drives the Art Association!

We have been very fortunate during this time. Thanks to your continued support – as members, donors, patrons, volunteers, teachers, and students - AAH has been able to keep the doors open to offer our classes and exhibits during the past two challenging years. Not all arts organizations have been so fortunate.

In fact, we only had to cancel one semester of classes due to COVID, and the number of students enrolling has been steadily growing since we re-opened in June of 2020. In the fiscal year leading up to COVID, and in the following year we averaged 265 students a year, but this year we have 405 enrolled through May. Special thanks to Nate for all his work on growing our student numbers! Behind the scenes the Board has been working hard with the staff on creating our new strategic plan to guide our work for the next few years.

Now, about this summer. There is a LOT going on.

Our 94th Annual Juried Exhibition (that's right, 94th!) is currently up through July 7th. That will be followed by our 5th Annual Free for All Exhibition opening on July 15th. Summer classes will also start that same week on July 18th, so register now!

I'm particularly looking forward to attending our three Summer Soirées to check out gorgeous homes, eat great food, and of course look at fabulous art. I hope to see you there. And don't forget that the Art Association is again hosting the 34th Annual Harrisburg Gallery Walk on September 11th – always a great day to wrap up the summer event schedule.

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

A Eulogy for Tracey Edgerly Meloni

Tracey Meloni, AAH Board Member Emeritus, patron of the arts, and dear and generous friend, died on June 7, just five days short of her birthday. She suffered a massive stroke on Sunday, June 5, and died two days later. I cannot begin to fathom that she is gone.

Tracey and I became friends as a result of the eulogy I wrote for my late Scottish Terrier Angus, in the AAH newsletter in July, 2004. She called me to say that she, too, was a Scottie lover, and when she and her husband Dr. Robert Meloni came to our house to purchase my painting of the Scottish Stones of Callanish, we became fast friends. She, Bob, my husband and I enjoyed each other's company, and they attended the AAH Bal Masque regularly as well as other galas. Elected to the AAH Board, Tracey went on to chair the Bal for several years, and to host a number of elegant Soirees at their home, even after Bob died 10 years ago.

She adored hats, and often incorporated hats in her Soiree themes! As an arts writer for Harrisburg Magazine, Tracey covered AAH events and exhibits, as well as other groups' offerings, including the Kitefest. She was a well-known travel writer for a number of publications in other states, and when Bob was alive, they traveled extensively, with her writing of their adventures for her publishers.

Tracey was born in The Chantry in the small village of Ravenstonedale in the Lake District in England, just before the end of World War II. When she knew my husband and I would be near Ravenstonedale on one of our trips to Britain, she asked me to photograph the Chantry to do a painting for her, which I did. Her connection to Ravenstonedale led to our friendship with Jackie and David Wedd, who live there, and who visited us and Tracey here in Harrisburg in 2019.

Tracey kept every friend she had ever made in her life, from her early childhood through her experiences in Washington, DC, working for Senator Warner, through her years in Harrisburg. She was unfailingly loyal and kind to her friends, and extremely supportive of artists. Many local artists were honored to have work in her extensive collection. Her taste in art and decorating were impeccable and visitors to her home during her Soirees were enchanted by her beautiful sanctuary.

Unfortunately, uncertain health kept Tracey from attending AAH events or going out socially during the past several years, which was magnified by COVID, but she always kept in touch via emails and social media, and continued to sponsor exhibitions and events, even without attending them. In fact, she offered to co-sponsor the July 30 soiree with Dr. Ettlinger, and her sister and brother-in-law will take her place in that capacity.

We are dedicating the July 30 Riverview Soiree to Tracey's memory.

Tracey Meloni's legacy as a true Patron of the Arts will live on in a myriad of ways. We all will miss her tremendously.

INTAKE: August 22 through September 5, during regular gallery hours of 9:30am-9pm Monday through Thursday, 9:30am-4pm Friday, 10am-4pm Saturday, and 2-5pm Sunday. AAH closes at 5pm on Labor Day, September 6.

ELIGIBILITY: All AAH artists whose dues are up to date are eligible to enter the show. (Artists may join or renew when entering the exhibition.)

RULES OF ENTRY:

- All artwork must convey the theme “SILVER SCREEN.”
- Limit 2 entries per artist.
- Entries may NOT have been exhibited in the AAH main galleries previously.
- All styles are acceptable, from abstraction, to realism, to Impressionism, to Expressionism, to Surrealism. All media are welcomed!
- No works may be larger than 48” in any direction.
- All 2-dimensional works MUST have screw-eyes and wire in place for hanging.
- All works on paper must be framed under glass or plexiglass. (No unframes permitted.)
- Works on stretched canvas may have painted edges in lieu of frames.
- All stained-glass pieces or fragile works of any kind may be entered only with a special appointment with Curator Rachel O’Connor. (Call her at 236-1432 or email her at rachel@artassocofhbg.com.)

ENTRY FEE: \$15 per entry.

AWARD CATEGORIES: Oil/Acrylic, Sculpture/Ceramics, Other Media, Photography, Watercolor, Pastels/Drawings, Robert Fuller Awards for Impressionism and Realism, Best Theme Interpretation, Best of Show.

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

CERAMICS & SCULPTURE

Hand-Built Pottery

(Ages 15 through Adult, Reservoir Park Pottery Studio, 10 weeks)

PAINTING & MIXED MEDIA

Acrylic Painting

(Ages 15 through Adult, AAH Third Floor, 9 weeks)

We will learn about acrylic paint by working on primed and unprimed canvases of different sizes.
