

Trinity to Infinity: Creative Expressions Opens February 25

The Art Association of Harrisburg is pleased to present "Trinity to Infinity: Creative Expressions" a three artist invitational, curated by AAH Director of Exhibitions Nate Foster. This exhibit features the work of three Pennsylvania-based artists: Thom Kulp, Brian Defrees, and Chet Davis. "Trinity to Infinity" will open with a reception on February 21 and remain on view until March 25.

Thom Kulp has always engaged in some sort of creative endeavor for as long as he can remember. He studied painting and drawing at Harrisburg Area Community College with the colorist painter Edith Socolow, and he has also learned from Linda McCloskey, Julie Yontz-Rupp, Phyllis Disher-Fredericks and Ron Schloyer. When asked about his choice of medium and style of work, Kulp says, "I paint in a non-objective manner, because I feel this gives me the greatest leeway to express my love of color, shape, form, texture and line. This also allows me to express my immediate emotional state at the time of creation. The great variety of acrylic-compatible media opens up vast worlds of self-discovery and experimentation. Any given painting of mine may contain, in no special order, multiple layers of acrylic paint, acrylic ink, fluid acrylics, colored chalk, charcoal,

colored pencil, Caran D'Ache crayons, gloss medium, and collage elements of paper. Each painting is a journey. It is never clear to me where the journey will lead. I take cues from the painting as to what my next step should be. It becomes an exciting revelation, an epiphany of unexpected juxtapositions, unplanned results that dazzle and beguile."

Brian Defrees, similarly, discovered at a very early age that he was a visual artist and his natural desire to make things has never waned. Since graduating from Tyler with honors, he has spent his career teaching in public schools including graphic design at Tyler, ceramics at The Community Arts Center in Wallingford, PA, in addition to being a freelance designer and illustrator. In this exhibit, Brian chose to showcase his 3D sculptural pieces and says, "In recent years, I've been free to explore ideas and materials in a more playful and personal way, with ceramic and paper sculpture, painting, and drawing especially."

Chet Davis has been an artist, art educator, and art advocate in Central Pennsylvania for over fifty years. He earned a BS in Art Education from Penn State University and a MA from the Hartford Art School. Having taught art at all levels, from elementary through university; he also is a very accomplished artist, having had more than 30 solo exhibitions and been included in curated invitationals and national juried shows. Davis feels James Hillman best defined art when he said, "Art is the visual manifestation of the soul's desperate concerns." Of his own work, Chet says, "My art is a way of augmenting feelings and defining observations of common human experiences that tie us together. Hence my work has an expressive, figurative focus, capturing a gestural, symbolic 'meaning of the moment'. The figures in my work are often portrayed in a decisive, emotional minute that will have a lasting impact on the human condition." Additionally, he gives Bay Area figure painters of the 1950s and 1960s as a starting point to his modernist painting style.

2025 "Figuratively Speaking" Exhibition Now Open!

The 2025 Figuratively Speaking Exhibition will be on view in the Art Association of Harrisburg galleries at 21 North Front Street from January 10 through February 13, sponsored by Board Member Emeritus Randy Michener. The awards reception will take place on Friday, January 17, 5-8pm, with lively music by the duo Free the Tweeds.

The prize judge for the exhibition will be artist Jeff Bye, who is an art professor at both Penn State Harrisburg and Elizabethtown University. The Art Association of Harrisburg's 97th Annual Juried Exhibition will be presented in the galleries at 21 North Front Street from May 16 through June 19, with the awards reception to take place Friday, May 23, from 5-8pm. The exhibition co-sponsors are AAH Board members emeriti Robert Potter and David Volkman. Music at the reception will be provided by the everpopular and versatile Jonathan Frazier.

The juror for the exhibition will be Abi Lua, Assistant Curator at the James A. Michener Art Museum in Doylestown, PA. She had previously held curatorial positions at Bryn Mawr College, The Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, and Philadelphia Contemporary. She specializes in American and global craft and material culture, and her research has been supported by

the Center for Material Culture Studies at the University of Delaware. Abi Lua holds a BA in History of Art from Bryn Mawr College, and an MA in American Material Culture from the Winterthur Museum, and the University of Delaware.

Entries in all styles and media will be eligible for digital submission via the AAH website at www.artassocofhbg.com, from February 12 through April 20. AAH Director of Exhibitions Nate Foster will notify artists of the acceptance or rejection of their entries after the works are juried by Abi Lua who will come to the Art Association on May 13 to select the award-winning artwork in the categories of Oils & Acrylics, Works on Paper, Other Media, Photography, Sculpture & Ceramics, and Best of Show.



CERAMICS & SCULPTURE

Clay Sculpture

(Ages 16 through Adult, Reservoir Park Sculpture Studio, 10 weeks)

For beginners and experienced artists alike, this class will adapt to the needs of all registrants. Learn to work water-based clay into a project of your choosing or follow the lead of the instructor. You are welcome to choose human or animal figure, still life or a variety of other subjects. Occasionally, live models, nude and/or draped, may be present. Freestanding and relief modes are available. Emphasis will be upon the techniques required to render a successful sculpture. You will have an opportunity to produce a final product that can be dried and fired. There will also be opportunities to meet outside of the scheduled class time, according to the needs of the group. Please express your interest even if the scheduled time is inconvenient for you. A small number of sculpting tools will be recommended for purchase. (MAXIMUM: 6 STUDENTS)

Hand-Built Pottery

Artists are encouraged to work at their own pace in the medium of their choice, whether it be paint, pencil, charcoal or pastel. PHOTOGRAPHY IS NOT PERMITTED. Supplies are not included and beginners are advised to bring a large drawing pad and compressed graphite sticks. AAH members receive a discount. (Model fee included in tuition fee.)

PAINTING & MIXED MEDIA

Acrylic Painting

(Ages 15 through Adult, AAH Third Floor, 9 weeks)

This class is for new, intermediate, and seasoned artists who want to learn the basics of acrylic painting, including color theory, color mixing, and painting techniques. We will learn about acrylic paint by working on primed and unprimed canvases of different sizes. Using photos, still-life objects, and imagination, students will become familiar with this medium, learn methods of composition, and paint application; creating works of art that are worthy of display.

Experimental Mixed Media

You will create mixed media works of art. All art experience levels are welcome!

Oil Painting
